John Frame says,

"Holiness is God's capacity and right to arouse our reverent awe and wonder. It is His uniqueness, his transcendence as our Creator. It is His majesty, that the holy God is like a great king, whom we dare not treat like other persons. Indeed, God's holiness impels us to worship in His presence.

Because we are sinners as well as creatures, God stands over against us, not only as transcendent, but as ethically pure. It is particularly as sinners that we fear to enter God's holy presence. When Isaiah heard the cry of the seraphs, Holy Holy Holy, he immediately remembered his own sin, WOE IS ME, FOR I AM LOST, for I am a man of unclean lips and I dwell in the midst of a people of unclean lips, for my eyes have seen the KING, the LORD OF HOSTS". Is. 6:5"

"And one called out to another and said, "Holy, Holy, Holy, is Yahweh of hosts; The whole earth is full of His glory.""

We are pushed away by God's holiness, we must stand back, to kneel, forboding and forbidden by His holiness to realize that it is His holiness that is our salvation. He draws us, when our sinfulness, like Isaiah's should repel us. Like Isaiah, it takes the act of God, His purifying of our sin, to allow us to draw near to the throne of Grace, to be close to His holiness as He continually makes intercession for us.

"I will not execute My burning anger; I will not make Ephraim a ruin again. For I am God and not man, the Holy One in your midst, And I will not come in wrath. They will walk after Yahweh; He will roar like a lion; Indeed, He will roar, And His sons will come trembling from the west." (Hosea 11:9–10 LSB)



Verse 2

Do we constantly call ourselves to remember?

Commands himself to NOT FORGET ANY

How dangerous are our memories. How often do we choose to remember the bad, the wrong, the evil, the hurt, and not the benefits.

"For men will be lovers of self, lovers of money, boastful, arrogant, blasphemers, disobedient to parents, ungrateful, unholy, unloving, irreconcilable, malicious gossips, without self-control, without gentleness, without love for good, treacherous, reckless, conceited, lovers of pleasure rather than lovers of God, holding to a form of godliness, but having denied its power. Keep away from such men as these." (2 Timothy 3:2–5 LSB)

Spurgeon says we drag up the refuse (the trash) of the past, but neglect the priceless treasures God has given. "The Lord has saved us with a great salvation, shall we render no recompense?"

Remember recompense from Ps. 91. Then it was the recompense of the wicked, now it's the recompense of God's benefits.

David begins to catalogue God's benefits.





Verse 3 **Pardon iniquities** Heals diseases

Verse 4 3. Redeem from the pit - kinsman redeemer - Ruth, Christ takes on flesh


